Player Profile JOHN CULBERTSON



John's story, as told by the man himself:

"I'm an Edinburgh lad, born in Gorgie in the late 1920's within light and sound of Hearts football ground, making it a really atmospheric start to life and place to grow up.

I left my local school at age 13 not because I particularly wanted to but because my mother needed the extra money that my labouring job would provide. We were a poor family but no poorer than others under the same

circumstances.

My first proper job was working at Princes Street Station as a railway ticket officer, but a few years before our good friend Jim Peebles! I eventually finished my service at Leith Station some time after World War II.

In this point in my life I began working for Edinburgh Merchant Company Schools and did so for the next 30 years until I retired. Within this I was responsible for teacher's salaries and pensions.

But all work and no play makes John a boring boy.....at the age of 16 I asked my mum to buy me a trumpet after being inspired by the great American Trumpeter Harry James, who had just been voted the best trumpeter in the world.

By the age of 18 I had to put down my trumpet while I served with the Army Air Movements Control in Egypt. I was lucky enough to see this part of the world and experience the grandeur of the pyramids but I did miss playing my trumpet, as it lay gathering dust under my bed.

But I soon got my lips back on the mouth piece and from then I have never put it down. Back then I played in 5-piece bands with saxophones, drums and piano and on few occasions played with the Clyde Valley Stampers, a real jazz experience! I have performed in music halls across the country and even in Edinburgh's Fat Sam's.

Today I still play lead trumpet with Esk valley Swing band, rehearsing every Wednesday in Bonnyrigg and have had 20 swinging years with them. But of course I also play Cornet with PSB, joining in November of 1984."



John is a true musician. He has a song for every occasion and a tune for every moment. The Band would like to acknowledge John's committed years of service and hope to hear him swingin' for many more.
